



DBA French-Indian War Style

This pictorial essay features my 28mm French and Indian War DBA-style project. The photo above shows the deployment of the British on the left and French on the right. Don't be confused of the amount of bright red worn by the French regulars. It is high summer and they have chosen to doff their coats exposing their regimental colored sleeved vests.

Picture two shows the British regulars in practical campaign dress supported by artillery ready to engage the French regulars in the distance. I have followed the DBA basing of 60mm frontages. The regulars are based four to an element, Provincials, militia, Regular lights and the like are three to an element, and the skirmish troops such as Indians, Rangers are two to an element.

Picture three shows Gage's 80th Regiment in skirmish formation (Gage's uniformed his boys in brown). Most of the figures are 28mm Front Rank and painted by myself, as was the basing. Natural pieces of rock and twigs were used. No trees were harmed in the making <grin>
